**This is a reminder for families to review the classroom placement policy information, which was sent in the April 1st newsletter.**

## **Student Attire (from the family handbook)**

The major responsibility for acceptable dress and grooming rests with the students and their parents.

Students are expected to dress appropriately for school and all school related events. A student's dress may not constitute a threat or disruption to the educational environments, health, safety, welfare or property of others, and must be in accordance with public decency, civil statutes and school expectations.

Students may not wear backless, strapless or tube top attire. Tops should have two thick straps (not spaghetti straps) and cover the midriff. All shorts and skirts should minimally come down to the mid-thigh. Students are required to wear shoes or sandals, preferably closed toe and heel for safety. Flip Flops are not recommended. Clothing should be worn appropriately and in a manner that covers all undergarments.

Clothes that promote the use of alcohol or drugs, profane, racially or gender biased or offensive language/pictures, or include sexually inappropriate references, will not be permitted to be worn at school or at school activities.

Any clothing or insignia that is deemed offensive, or cause for inciting others, will be prohibited from being worn or displayed on school premises. If clothing is deemed unacceptable, students will be directed to correct the situation. Wickham students may not wear hats or other head coverings, including bandanas, in the building. When a commercial line of apparel is judged to have such a high proportion of unacceptable imprints that a case by case review of each item would disrupt the orderly activity of the school, then a complete ban of the line of apparel will be made.

We recognize that attire acceptable outside the school may not be considered appropriate in school.

Students found to be in violation of these expectations will be asked to make adjustments to their clothing or asked to change. School consequences will be assigned in the event that a student is unwilling to make the requested adjustment. If approved by administrators prior to wearing the attire, student attire rules may be adjusted for medical or religious reasons.
